**Euclid Avenue Resurfacing Project
Traffic Advisory
Ivanhoe Road to Upper Valley Drive
(Ward 10)**

Expect additional traffic notices as improvements continue

CLEVELAND – On Monday June 26, 2023, weather permitting, the ODOT's contractor will begin mobilizing and establishing traffic controls on Euclid Avenue from Ivanhoe Road to Upper Valley Drive.

Overall Project Description:

Resurfacing of approximately 1.24 miles of Euclid Ave. From Ivanhoe Road / West Belvoir Blvd. To Upper Valley Drive. Work will include milling of existing asphalt and replacement, along with full depth repairs, utility castings adjustments, ADA compliant curb ramps, landings, pavement markings and signing throughout the project length.

Maintenance of Traffic:

The first phase of construction will be limited to the center lanes. Two lanes of traffic will be maintained in both directions during non-working hours in the North and South Lanes. During work hours traffic will be restricted to one lane in each direction while construction operations are active.

Street parking will not be permitted during construction.

Intersections and Side Streets will remain open during this work.

Resurfacing operations are weather dependent and may be rescheduled as necessary

Electronic message boards have been placed on either end of the construction informing the public of the impending construction work. Advanced warning signs will be placed prior to any work starting.

The work will generally take place during the hours of 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Construction is scheduled to be completed in November 2023.
