1. OPS 2024-0251

Complainant: Mr. Darrell Houston Sgt. David Harris, #9146

Summary: On 10/7/2024, the complainant stated that he was approached in an aggressive and unprofessional manner in the parking lot behind City Hall following a meeting. The complainant feels that he was harassed based on the fact that he was carrying a firearm.

Allegation A: Improper Procedure – Stop

Recommendation: Exonerated – Improper Stop against Sgt. David Harris, #9146 The Manual of Rules for the Conduct and Discipline of Employees of the Cleveland Division of Police, Sections 4.01 and 4.18 and General Police Order (GPO 2.02.01) support a finding that the alleged conduct occurred but the Officer's actions were consistent with law, Cleveland Division of Police General Police Orders, training or procedures.

Allegation B: Harassment

Recommendation: Unfounded. Harassment allegation against Sgt. David Harris, #9146, The Manual of Rules for the Conduct and Discipline of Employees of the Cleveland Division of Police, Sections 3.01 and 5.01 support a finding that the alleged conduct did not occur.

2. OPS 2024-0158

Complainant: Ms. Shelia Foster Dispatcher Makeba Greer, #111

Summary: On 6/24/24, the complainant called police in response to her son being in crisis. The complainant contends that the Dispatcher was rude and laughed at her.

Allegation A: Unprofessional Behavior/Conduct

Recommendation: Unfounded- Based on the preponderance of the evidence to include the 911 call audio, event chronology and Bureau of Communications and Property Control Communications Control Section policy No. 1.1.17, Call Taking Procedures revised 1/9/23, supports a finding that the alleged conduct did not occur. Additionally, Dispatcher Greer followed Bureau of Communications and Property Control Communications Control Section policy No. 1.1.18, General Dispatching Procedures, revised 2/10/17.

3. OPS 2024-0104

Complainant: Ms. Darlene Cozart P.O. Diovanni Smith, #285

Summary: On 4/27/24, the complainant was parked in front of the Hannah Building, during which time a valet backed into their vehicle. The complainant contacted police and provided their proof of insurance but feels the police did an insufficient job in obtaining and sharing the proof of insurance of the other party to her.

Allegation A: Lack of Service – Insufficient Service

Recommendation: Exonerated – The preponderance of the evidence to include the WCS footage and electronic report records reflects that P.O. Diovanni Smith, #285 investigated the accident and completed the oH-1 Report 2024-00114007, consistent with manual Section 4.18 and GPO 8.1.02. Additionally, neither ORC 4549.01 nor any Manual Section or GPO required P.O. Smith to provide insurance or driver's license information directly to the complainant. 4. OPS 2023-0111

Complainant: Mr. Robert Walker Sgt. Daniel Florentz, #9340 Sgt. Michael Harper, #9230 Det. Dylan Madej, #2078

Summary: On 4/11/2023, the complainant claims that they were pulled over for no reason. The complainant claims that the officer stated that they pulled him over because of a turn signal but then stated they stopped him because they witnessed a hand-to-hand drug transaction.

Complainant: Mr. Ryan Bethards P.O. Vickie Phillips, #1766

Summary: On 12/13/2024, the complainant was escorted out of Aldi. During the interaction with the police officer, the complainant claims that the officer was unprofessional and used excessive force.

Allegation A: Unprofessional Behavior/Conduct

Recommendation: Insufficient Evidence- The preponderance of the evidence fails to establish whether the alleged conduct did or did not occur. The video footage from the Aldi store did not contain audio. Manual of Rules 5.01, 5.08 and 5.09. Motion: Sharp Second: Parker Motion: Carried

Allegation B: Excessive Force

Recommendation: Exonerated – The preponderance of the evidence to include the officer's WCS footage finding that the alleged conduct did occur but the officer's actions were consistent with law, Cleveland Division of Police General Police Orders, training or procedures. Mr. Bethards was escorted out of the store with de minimis force. GPO 2.01.01 Manual of Rules 4.05
