Pipeline Infrastructure Improvements Update

Thursday, March 19, 2020

**Dominion Energy Ohio Gas Pipeline Infrastructure Replacement
Project – PIR 3262 – East 143rd Street and Miles Avenue
(City of Cleveland - Ward 1)**

CLEVELAND – On Thursday, March 19, 2020, Dominion Energy Ohio’s gas pipeline infrastructure replacement project will begin on the following streets:

- East 143rd Street – From Miles Avenue to Benwood Avenue
- Harvard Avenue – Street Crossing at the intersection of Harvard Avenue and East 143rd Street
- Benwood Avenue – Street Crossing at the intersection of Benwood Avenue and East 143rd Street

The improvements include replacing the old steel mainline with a new plastic mainline in the sidewalk area. A work zone will be established which will allow two-way traffic with traffic control personnel present to help direct traffic flow. Access to adjacent driveways will be maintained throughout construction. All work zones will be removed at the end of each work day. The work on the project will take place Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

This project is scheduled for completion in July 2020. Should the weather not allow for permanent restoration to the sidewalk, a temporary 2” thick concrete sidewalk will be installed for pedestrian traffic. A concrete cap will be placed on all road crossings until permanent concrete restorations can be completed.
